Multiple agencies from across Lee County visited Bonita Springs' fire training grounds at Fire Station Four on March 1st to give their rookie firefighters a chance to acquire practical fire training skills. Bonita Springs' burn building, commemoratively named *Paul's House Of Pain* in honor of our late Training Captain, is one of only two in the entire county. The building is comprised of Conex containers which are designed to simulate fire in a structure. Fire is placed strategically inside the building to provide firefighters with training on breaching, extinguishment, and rescue tactics inside the manufactured structure. We thank Estero Fire, San Carlos Fire, South Trail Fire, Iona-McGregor Fire, Fort Myers Beach Fire, City of Fort Myers Fire, and City of Cape Coral Fire for their professionalism and hard work. Over 70 of Lee County's firefighters, 16 of Bonita's own, participated in the successful training.
